Why leave a legacy?

Leaving a gift in your Will to the Catholic Children's Society (Plymouth) is an inspiring way to show you care by providing support and security to children and families when they need it most.

A legacy does not need to be a large sum of money. A gift in a Will, however large or small, plays an important part in continuing the work of the Society as we rely entirely on donations from generous supporters.

£50 could provide a much needed school uniform for a child whose parents are finding it hard to make ends meet



£100 could buy essential baby equipment for a family with little money to spare

£100 could provide a bed and mattress for a child who is either sleeping on the floor every night or who perhaps has to share a bed with a sibling or a parent

£250 could provide a family with a new washing machine or an electric cooker to help prepare a healthy balanced diet for the family

What to do next

It is recommended to seek legal advice when making a Will. A solicitor will ensure that your wishes will be carried out correctly. They will advise you about the value of your estate and what will happen to it after your death. They can also discuss **Inheritance Tax** with you and how to allow your executors to manage your estate tax effectively.

There are a number of ways to include the Society in your Will: residuary, pecuniary and specific.

Residuary: by leaving a percentage (or the whole) of the residue of your estate after all dependents, other gifts and costs have been provided for

Pecuniary: by leaving a specific sum of money which can be index linked to preserve its value

Specific: by leaving a particular asset to the charity

A solicitor will advise on the specific wording you need to use for different types of gifts.

This suggested legal wording will assist your solicitor in drawing up or amending your will to include your gift to help our vital work :

"I give to Catholic Children's Society (Plymouth) (charity number 282803) the sum of pounds [or a share of my residuary estate] for the general charitable purposes of the Society. I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Society will be a sufficient discharge to my Trustees/executors".

"I am writing to thank you most sincerely for your help...I can now move forward and begin my life again. My children are very young and I can only begin to tell you how much this will enable me to stand on my own two feet and create a family home where my children will have the opportunity to develop and grow in a safe, loving environment." Already made a Will?

Minor changes can be made to include the Society in an existing Will by way of a codicil.

Please remember that a Will remains valid unless you marry, remarry or make a new one.
